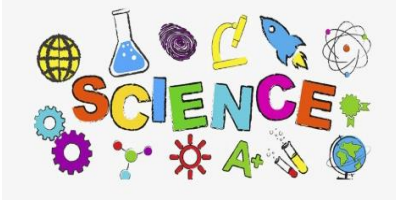
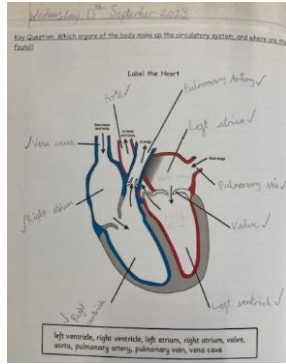

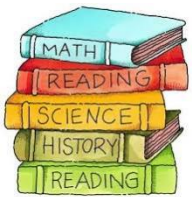

Our class had a great day immersing ourselves in our new topic 'Blood, Sweat and Tears' on the World War II Day. The children made gas mask boxes, medals and their own board games to keep them occupied in the Anderson shelter. We have begun our Humanities learning by identifying the countries involved in the War and discussing the concept of Axis and Allies.



In English, we have been studying how to write an emotive letter. We have focused on descriptive vocabulary and how to communicate a character's emotion - without stating it. To practice these skills, we have written letters as World War Two evacuees writing to our families to describe our new home.

Our class book this term is 'Letters of the Lighthouse' by Emma Carroll. This book is supporting us to consider what life was like for evacuees during World War II as the main characters in the story have been evacuated to a fictional seaside village in Devon.



We have begun our year consolidating and extending our understanding of place value. This included rounding numbers to any required degree of accuracy and multiplying/dividing by powers of 10.

We have also just begun our addition and subtraction unit. We will be practising addition using a variety of methods (number lines, expanded column method and contracted column method) so that we can select the most efficient strategy for a particular question.
