In Science, we have continued to learn about the circulatory system whilst focusing on our enquiry skills. We have presented the information that we have learnt so far this year in an information text. Also, we have used comparative testing to explore what foods have a higher fat content. As well as this, we have gone over the parts of the body involved in the digestion system and what happens at each stage.
