News from the Federation – 24th January 2025






Keeping Children Safe Online

This year, the English team has introduced a new reading curriculum that is focused on whole-class teaching and the explicit teaching of reading. As part of developing the new reading curriculum the team has mapped out high quality, age appropriate texts that each year group will use in lessons throughout the year. In establishing the curriculum, they have collected pupil voice to see pupils' thoughts on the new lessons.
