


in Year 1





We have continued learning about our bodies and have focused on the five senses. We carried out a smell test, went for a walk around school to see what sounds we could hear, talked about our favourite tastes and described what different objects in the classroom look and feel like.

In Maths, we have been focusing on addition and subtraction. We have been using manipulatives such as Numicon, counters, tens frames, part-whole models and number lines to help us.

We have also been learning about 2-D and 3-D shapes and making repeating patterns using shapes.

Finally, we have started to learn about multiplication by learning to count in 2s, 5s and 10s and adding equal groups.
