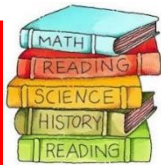

In English, we delved into the 'James and the Giant Peach' story - innovating its characters, setting, organising it into paragraphs. We used grammar features such as similes, alliteration, fronted adverbials of time and conjunctions to write wonderful stories inspired by Roald Dahl, through a series of peculiar and magical happenings.



In History, we crossed curriculum with Art and the products were outstanding. Pupils took on board the learning and shared with the classroom rich pieces of work. From Stone Age to Iron Age, pupils recreated cave paintings, houses and tools from Ancient Britain.



In Maths, we carried on using place value to add and subtract. Pupils worked hard adding numbers mentally and then working with larger numbers using formal written methods of column addition and on a number line.



In Religion Studies, we explored the traditions of Judaism. Children looked at the importance of the Ten Commandments and the Torah. Children also recreated and decorated the Jewish symbol - the Hamsa Hand. We have learnt that it has a universal sign of protection, power and strength.
